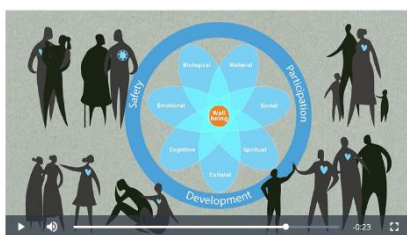
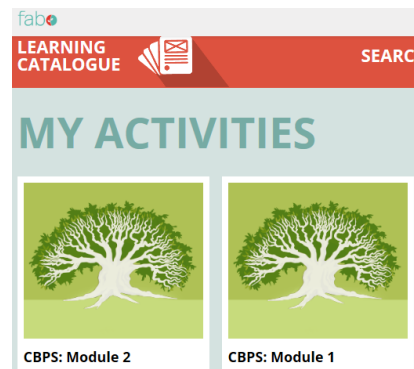

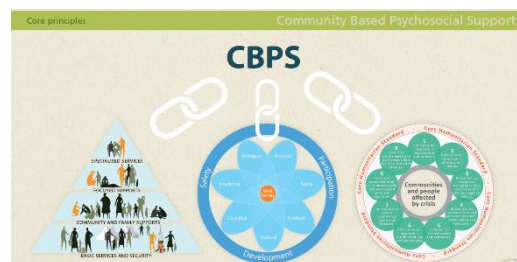
Church of Sweden's International Department is proud to present two new CBPS e-learning modules. The modules are produced in collaboration with DCA/ Learning lab, and are available for all users on fabo.org. If you don't already have an account, you can register for free on the site and create a fabo-login.



The CBPS Module 1 is a short introduction to Community Based Psychosocial Support (CBPS), aiming to give you a basic understanding and key benefits of applying this approach in humanitarian response work, and in nexus and development projects. This module focus on *Why* you should apply CBPS. The “Why CBPS?” film can be downloaded

The CBPS Module 2 builds on Module 1, and focuses on *What is CBPS* in practical terms. This module is about 45 minutes, and look into:

- The concept of psychosocial wellbeing
- Understanding different layers of psychosocial support
- How the CBPS core principles relate to other standards



You can access the CBPS Modules on <https://fabo.org/> or you can download the app “Moodle” through google play and app store. Moodle app is available for mobile devices, and Moodle desktop app for Microsoft/Mac. You can find the desktop app here: <https://download.moodle.org/desktop/> . When you have downloaded the Moodle app, register fabo.org as your course site, log in and search for CBPS module 1 and 2. When using the app you can download the e-learnings to your mobile device, and have it available for offline use.

When you revisit the e-learning after having finalised a training, the system will ask if you want to resume where you left off. It is important that you click *yes*, otherwise your progress in the e-learning will reset. When you click *yes* you will have access to all the sections you have passed in the training.
